Welcome

to The Business Recycling Services Directory,
A guide to commercial recycling in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

The Directory has been put together by the RECAP (Recycling in Cambridge And Peterborough) Trade Waste Recycling Team. The team is funded by the Business Resource Efficiency and Waste Programme (BREW) with its primary role to provide support to local Small & Medium businesses (SMEs) in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, by finding ways to help divert recyclable waste away from landfill.

This guide gives an overview of contractors who provide recycling services in the area, the materials they take, bin sizes and their approximate costs as well as giving details of local groups that are involved in recycling. We've also included information on the current legislative and cost drivers for recycling, and some handy tips to help reduce waste and save on disposal costs.

It is the responsibility of businesses to ensure that the waste they produce is correctly disposed of and the business should make sure that any contractor used is correctly licensed to handle that waste via the Environment Agency web site:

BREW and RECAP:

BREW, the Business Resource Efficiency and Waste Programme was set up through DEFRA to use funds collected through the Landfill Tax to incentivise businesses to reduce the amount of waste they send to landfill and to assist them by finding ways to achieve this, nationally we generate some 400m tonnes of waste and neither landfill or incineration provide sustainable long term solutions to dealing with this waste.

RECAP, Recycling in Cambridge And Peterborough is designed to help local residents and businesses to reduce, re-use and recycle by providing information and practical advice as well as links to other groups in the County that work in the recycling and re-use sector.



The Real Cost of Commercial Waste:

Businesses in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough are responsible for producing approximately 1,000,000 tonnes of waste per year. All businesses, no matter what size, should have a trade waste agreement with a registered waste carrier; they have a duty to ensure that any waste produced is handled safely and within the law. This is the businesses 'duty of care', It applies to anyone who produces, imports, transports, stores, treats or disposes of waste from business or industry.

Businesses must ensure that:

- All waste is stored and disposed of responsibly.
- Waste is only handled or dealt with by people or businesses that are authorised to do so.
- Records are kept of all waste that is transferred or received for at least two years.

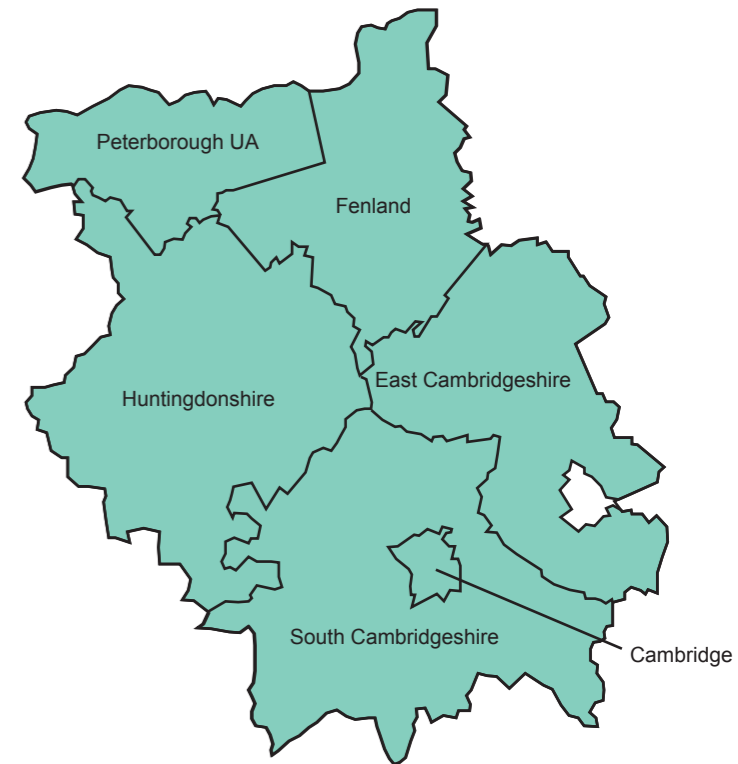
Trade waste cannot be accepted at any of the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Household Waste Recycling Sites, nor should it be put into residential recycling or general waste bins. It is illegal to dispose of trade waste in this way and the local Council can investigate any person illegally disposing of waste like this and may issue fines or take legal action against them.

From October 30th 2007, updated Landfill Regulations now mean that no commercial waste can be disposed of at landfill unless it can be demonstrated to have undergone a treatment process.

The simplest way to provide this treatment is to remove a proportion of the waste for recycling. This can be done at source within your business, or by your waste collection service provider. The latter of these methods will often incur significant costs. Policy Enforcement teams will be monitoring business compliance with this new legislation.

We are therefore presented with an excellent opportunity to find ways to develop new, practical, cost effective and "green" outlets for your business waste as we adapt for new legislation.

Cambridge and Peterborough Cities already have council run trade recycling services, as they have the density of businesses to make such a service cost effective. At present the rural Districts Councils have no trade recycling services available. As such RECAP is backing a program to develop 'at source' business waste recycling schemes in Huntingdonshire, Fenland, South and East Cambridgeshire District Council areas, by working with local and national private contractors.

Hazardous Wastes

With ever-tightening laws on waste disposal, it is important that your bin does not contain anything that is deemed hazardous. Common wastes that are unsuitable for general disposal or recycling include:

- Plasterboard,
- Asbestos,
- Fridges, Freezers, Air-conditioning units,
- Tyres,
- Electrical appliances,
- Batteries,
- Medical waste,
- Fluorescent light tubes,
- Paints (including residues inside paint cans) and solvents,
- Aerosols and gas canisters,
- Liquids,
- Oil, fuel and other automotive fluids,
- Hazardous / Toxic waste.

The Hazardous Waste Regulations 2005 places strict requirements on companies that produce such waste, how it is stored, who is able to collect it, what must be done to dispose of it legally and it also outlines what records must be kept. Please note that the above list is not definitive, for a full list of Hazardous items please refer to the regulations, available from the Environment Agency.



Top Tips for making the most of your recycling:

- **Close Proximity.** If possible choose a contractor close to your business. The less distance the waste has to be transported the less CO₂ is released in to the atmosphere. Proximity to the contractor should also mean a lower quote for the service.
- **Ring Around.** Like most things, if you spend the time to shop around you can eventually pick up a bargain.
- **Time for a change?** Even if you have a recycling scheme in place you may be able to find a more comprehensive service at a more competitive price; so it's always worth checking every 12 months or so.
- **Flat Pack.** If you take the time to flatten all the material going in to your recycling you will be able to fit much more in. Reducing the need for it to be picked up so often, saving your business money and benefiting the environment further.
- **Segregate.** If space allows have separate general waste and recycling bins throughout your business. This should remove the temptation for people to simply mix everything in together for landfill, and will make things much easier when it comes to putting it in to the correct wheelie bin or skip.
- **Reuse.** You can reduce your waste's impacts further by not throwing it away at all. For example, rather than just recycling your office paper, could it be shredded for packaging? Is there anyone out there who could find a use for your waste? To find out contact one of the Reuse organisations listed at the end of this directory.
- **Education.** Making sure that everyone in the business is aware of any recycling system you set up will ensure its success.
- **Champions.** Could one of your staff be responsible for making sure waste is managed correctly? Having someone passionate on recycling to manage your business's waste could not only give them greater job satisfaction, but will also be an encouragement to other staff members to make sure the system runs smoothly.
- **Always Ask.** Don't be afraid to ask your waste contractor to provide you with information about what happens to the waste you send for recycling. They should be able to provide you with the paperwork showing the final destination of your recyclables.
- **Group Together.** If your business produced only a small amount of recyclables you may find that the services currently available to your needs are very limited. If your property is rented could you group together with other businesses in the building or complex, and convince your landlord to provide a communal recycling service?

Public Relations and the Feel Good factor:

- Illegal dumping or evading waste compliance could lead to public disclosure of fines or prosecution.
- Following recycling and proper waste disposal regulations gives a business an opportunity to promote their environmentally friendly practices to customers and will help in meeting their Corporate Social Responsibility requirements.
- Things could be taken a step further, with recycling as a starting point to a wider environmental management system and gaining accreditation to schemes such as ISO14001 and BS 8555. These are internationally recognised commitments to environmentally aware business practices, and are becoming increasingly powerful marketing aids for a business holding them.



- The feel good factor of recycling at work is undeniable. In a recent SME Recycling trial, nearly half identified employee morale as the best reason to undertake a recycling scheme. 82% stated that their people needed no encouragement when it came to recycling their waste!

- RECAP can also provide support for businesses wanting to publicise their commitment to compliance and recycling through the Keep Britain Tidy Business Awards. For more information contact the Trade Waste Team.



Environmental Benefits:

- Disposing of your waste in a sustainable manner prevents occurrence of illegal dumping (fly-tipping), improving the appearance of the local environment.
- Less waste in landfill frees up land for other uses and reduces the production of powerful green house gases.
- Recycling saves raw materials and energy. Recycling just one glass bottle saves enough energy to light a 15 watt low energy efficient bulb (equivalent to a 100 watt normal bulb) for 24 hours!
- Purchasing fewer raw materials means less virgin resources are used, preserving the environment for future generations.



How Is The Waste Recycled?

One question which comes up time and time again is 'what happens to our recycling?' The specifics will differ between each waste contractor, so feel free to ask them. But to give you a general idea, here is the usual process for dealing with a mixed recyclables collection:

- Once collected the material can be taken to a waste transfer station for sorting. This will often incorporate the use of a Materials Reclamation Facility (MRF).
- The mixed recyclables enter the MRF and are segregated into in to the different types using a selection of: ballistic separators to separate by size and weight; vibration plates to regulate material flow; magnets to separate steel; Eddy current generators to separate Aluminium; and infrared scanners to separate the different type of plastics. The segregated materials are then bailed up before transport to processing facilities.
- Depending on the quality of the material it can be processed for similar uses; e.g. office paper can return to you as a news paper; or for a very different use, e.g. recycled glass is often used as an aggregate for road building.
- The UK does not currently have the capacity to process all of the material segregated for recycling. Where this

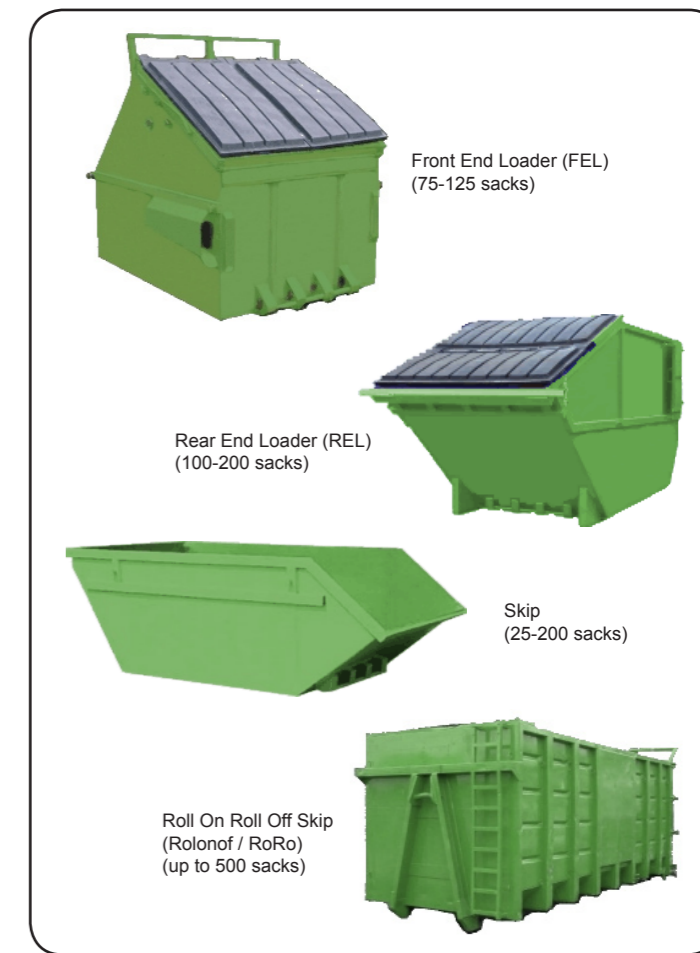
is the case the material is shipped to countries with the facilities to deal with the material. For example all Tetra Pak cartons collected for recycling in the UK are currently transported to Sweden for processing.

- Where possible the recycling material will be shipped in the empty containers of goods imported in to the UK. This system allows otherwise empty containers to be reused as they return to their home ports.



Know your Bin:

The services listed in this booklet and any recycling contractor you may speak to often have what at first glance may seem like a confusing amount of different container names. The images below are designed to give you a better idea of what you might require. The images below are not shown on a relative scale. So you can get a better idea of the size of the bin there is an estimation of how many standard size sacks each one will hold.
